Why AICCRA?

Acute food insecurity:

- > 46 m people in Central and Southern Africa
- > 44 m people in East Africa
- > 30 m people in West Africa and the Sahel
- (People in Crisis or worse (IPC Phase 3 or above) 2022 FSIN Global Report on Food Crises)



Increased temperature has contributed to a 34% reduction in agricultural productivity growth in Africa since 1961. This is more than any other region in the world. (*State of the Climate in Africa 2021 Report*)



In recent years, many **extreme and high-impact events were reported across Africa**. The continent was affected by heavy rainfall, floods, land-falling tropical cyclones, droughts, heatwaves, wildfires, and sandstorms.



Of the 51 Member States that reported progress in implementing the **Malabo Declaration** during the 2021 CAADP Biennial Review cycle, **only one country (Rwanda) is on-track**. (3rd CAADP Biennial Review Report)



The majority of African Parties to the Paris Climate Agreement mention agriculture and food security, water, health, and disaster risk reduction as top priority areas for adaptation in their NDCs. (State of the Climate in Africa 2021 Report)

What is AICCRA?

AICCRA works to scale climate-smart agriculture and climate information services that reach millions of smallholder farmers in Africa.

AICCRA is a CGIAR project led by the Alliance of Bioversity International and CIAT


It is supported by a grant from the International Development Association (IDA) of the World Bank.

AICCRA has teams in six countries: Senegal, Ghana, Mali, Ethiopia, Kenya and Zambia

> It also has two regional teams focusing on 'West Africa' and 'East & Southern Africa'.

The original 'Project Development Objective' was to **reach 1.5 million smallholder farmers in Africa** with climate-smart agriculture and climate services.


So far, we've reached nearly 3 million.

AICCRA strengthened the technical capacity of AGRHYMET—West Africa's regional climate centre—in 'NextGen' seasonal climate forecasting system, allowing a shift to dynamic forecast models. A regional community of practice for foresight in West and Central Africa established with AICCRA support is improving regional preparedness and response plans to pest and disease outbreaks driven by climate change.

The African Group of Negotiators Expert Support (AGNES) strengthened the science that informs their position in UNFCCC agricultural negotiations thanks to AICCRA.

In East and Southern Africa, AICCA's partnership with RUFORUM, ICARDA, and IRI led to16 universities including CIS and CSA content in their curriculums. In total, AICCRA has forged 23 partnerships with universities across Africa.


AICCRA impact | 8 March 2023

- AICCRA's work in Kenya instrumental in the design of the World Bank USD 365m 'De-risking, inclusion and value enhancement of pastoral economies in the Horn of Africa' (DRIVE) project.
- AICCRA collaborates closely with the World Bank's West Africa Food Systems Resilience Program (FSRP).
- AICCRA work with CORAF to strengthen foresight to manage transboundary and climate-driven pests and diseases in West and Central Africa is helping facilitate a potential USD 70m investment by AfDB.

Sharing knowledge & inspiring action

- AICCRA produced 37 peer-reviewed open access papers in 2022.
- On the AICCRA website, there are more than 90 briefs available, complemented by a learning zone filled with 50 open-access tools and resources that help put CSA into practice.
